Over the last several months you may have noticed all the construction around our Library! Do you remember the semi-truck taking up a big section of the parking lot? Or when we had to operate out of the Little House for a week? Maybe the plywood covered windows? Perhaps having no way to enter through the front doors? Even if it didn't feel like it at the time, it's all been worth it!

You may ask "Was this all necessary for you just to be able to check out your library items?" Well, let us tell you, "Yes, it was definitely necessary!" We started having leaks throughout the building the last few years. Water and books just don't go together! Caring for the library building and the collections housed inside it, the Board of Trustees decided to prioritize budgeted building funds and move forward with the plan to replace the roof and upgrade the windows.

We did a little research and determined that the windows and roof were last replaced <u>25 years ago</u> when the large building addition took place in 1998. After a few patches to the roof and windows, it became glaringly obvi-

ous that it was time for new and updated fixes. We now have a new roof with a 30-year warranty. New tinted windows and aluminum framing - both now require less maintenance, saving the Library money over the long term. No more looking out the windows just to see fog or water in between the panes of glass or rusted framing holding them in place.

We are thankful for your patience through it all. We are also very grateful for an endowment that came at just the right time to get this project completed. Arvel and Maridel Fowler were longtime residents of Bethalto. They named the Library in their Trust, supporting our mission to provide a place for everyone to read, connect to others, and explore our world. The Fowler's gift will now help keep the Library and its collections open for our whole community to enjoy for many years.

Please bring any passwords or pins for devices, emails, etc. Including your Apple ID password.


