Explanation of June Activities



Storytime – Storytimes are designed for children ages 3-7. They offer a fun time of listening to books, songs, crafts, and snacks. Caregivers must stay with the children during this 45-minute program. Ages are only suggestions.



Lapsit – Lapsits are designed for our youngest patrons (0-36 months) and their caregivers. Stories, songs, and simple crafts fill this 30-minute program. Ages are only suggestions.



Book Club – This is an informal discussion group for adults. The current book selection is posted in the Library and on the library's website.



Book A Librarian – Call Paula at the Library to schedule your one on one eReader tutorial. Bring your device to learn how to use Overdrive and 3M, the Library's free downloadable media services.



Knit Night – Join our group for a relaxing time of chatting and knitting. Bring whatever project you are working on - knitting, crocheting, quilting, etc! Having trouble? We can help! Want to learn? We can help with that, too! Drop by the Young Adult section of the Library. RSVP not required.
